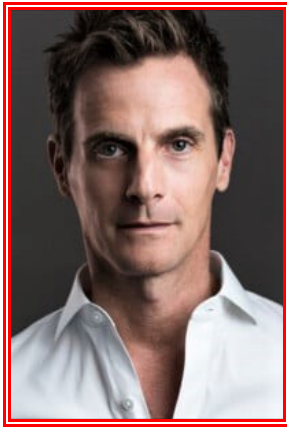


Barrington Stage Company, Pittsfield, MA

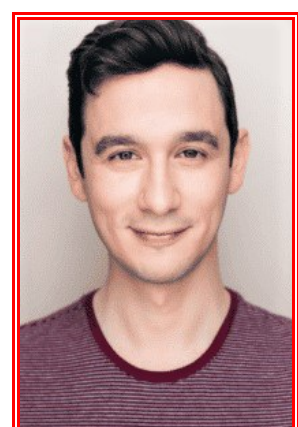
